Pastor Tim's Main Idea:

Key Questions:

- What's one idea from the message that really stood out to you? Why did this idea grab your attention?
- How important was the subject of the Kingdom of God to Jesus?
- How does our understanding of the Kingdom of God effect the mission and purpose of the church?
- Identify one teaching of Jesus on the subject of the Kingdom of God and explain what it means to you.

Next Steps

- What's one thing you will do this week as a result of something you learned from this message?
- Take time to reflect on whether you identify yourself as a citizen of the Kingdom of God. How does that make you feel?
- Take time to write down the various principles that Jesus taught concerning the Kingdom of God and identify ways that it effects your life.

What is the Kingdom of God?

1. The Beginning Message of Jesus

"From that time Jesus began to preach and say, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.'" Matthew 4:17

"The time has come," he said, "The kingdom of God has come near. Repent and believe the good news.'" Mark 1:15

2. The Missional Reason of Jesus

"But He said, 'I must proclaim the good news of the kingdom of God to the other towns also, because that is why I was sent.'" Luke 4:43

3. The Training Message of Jesus

"And He called the twelve together, and gave them power and authority over all the demons and to heal diseases. And He sent them out to proclaim the kingdom of God and to perform healing." Luke 9:2

4. The Final Message of Jesus

"To these He also presented Himself alive after His suffering, by many convincing proofs, appearing to them over a period of forty days and speaking of the things concerning the kingdom of God." Acts 1:3

5. The Last Day Message of Jesus

"This gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in the whole world as a testimony to all the nations, and then the end will come." Matthew 24:14

Early Adventist Understanding of Mission

 2. A movement within Christendom
 3. Presupposed the ability to read
 4. Missionaries were requested
